

# CACI Awarded \$54 Million Task Order to Support the U.S. Army with Advanced Ground Sensors

RESTON, Va.--(BUSINESS WIRE)-- CACI International Inc ([NYSE: CACI](#)) announced today that it has been awarded a five-year task order valued at up to \$54 million to continue supporting the U.S. Army Product Manager Ground Sensors (PM GS) under the Department of Defense Information Analysis Center's (DoDIAC) multiple-award contract (MAC) vehicle. CACI will provide current and future operational capability and efficiency throughout the life cycle of critical ground sensors, including night vision, electro-optics, and thermal systems used by warfighters at home and abroad.
